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Cosumnes Groundwater Authority's Charge

- To create financial and other efficiencies beneficial to implement SGMA and the Cosumnes Subbasin Groundwater Sustainability Plan (and PMAs).
- PMAs should help achieve the GSP's Sustainability Goal:
 - To ensure that groundwater in the Subbasin continues to be a long-term resource for beneficial users and uses including urban, domestic, agricultural, industrial, environmental and others. This goal will be achieved by managing groundwater within the Basin's sustainable yield, as defined by sustainable groundwater conditions and the absence of undesirable results.
- Guiding Principles for PMAs:
 - Preferred PMAs are cost effective, provide multiple benefits, have high probability for success, and maintain the viability of current beneficial uses of groundwater within the Subbasin.
 - [Supply] Augmentation from wet year supplies is preferred over demand reduction when feasible.
 - "these activities [in Phase 1] will focus on refining concepts into actionable projects that can be implemented in Phase 2 of the GSP (2028-2042)."

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- Significant uncertainties still need to be explored
- Relies primarily on access to surface water



- Could be readily implemented once benefits determined
- Does NOT rely on access to water

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Cosumnes Subbasin Projects

- While it is the GSP's priority to rely on supply augmentation projects, significant planning is required before significant benefits will be seen.
- "PMA implementation will be conducted on parallel tracks."
- Color bars indicated estimated gross benefits from projects during each phase.

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Groundwater Storage Benefit Targets

Phase 1 (2022-2027)


- Supply Augmentation:
 - 0 AFY, studies/pilot
- Demand Management:
 - 2,700 AFY net reduction of pumping

Phase 2 (2028-2042)

- Supply Augmentation:
 - 21,000 AFY gross
 - ~10,000 AFY net
- Demand Management:
 - benefits from voluntary practices

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PMA Committee, cont.

Draft PMA Committee Charge/Work Plan:

- An advisory body
- Aligned with the guiding principles in the Cosumnes GSP, develop recommended actionable tasks to guide PMA implementation
 - To be used to inform grants, fee study, etc.
- Meet monthly (or more frequently as needed)
- Conduct needed outreach (ex: farmer survey, joint meetings with Citizen Advisory Committee, focus groups, etc.) to better understand feasibility of projects
- To provide actionable tasks for PMA implementation to the CGA Board by November 2022

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Next Steps

- Next Steps:
 - Affirm PMA Committee charge/work plan and CGA's approach to projects.
 - Development recommendation of actionable tasks to guide GSP implementation by November 2022.
 - Farmer's Focus Group and Survey
 - Detailed accounting of current and potential demand management strategies
 - Develop demand management implementation "needs"
 - Tentative Next PMA Meeting: Sept 27 (afternoon)
 - Staff/Consultant Direction
 - Work with PMA Committee to distribute the Farmer's Demand Management Survey
 - Target highest water use
 - Include representation of medium and low water use
 - Response dates: October 31st; November 30th

 - · Small, nimble, and informal team
 - Brainstorms and vets initial ideas to encourage public participation, builds on suggestions from CAC and others
 - CGA Board is the decision-maker on outreach and budget expenditures
 - Is deliberate about methods for targeted outreach
 - Helps with O&E implementation, as available

- Discussed potential elements of high-level proposed O&E plan for Sept-Dec
 - Fall public workshop
 - Meetings and other O&E leading up to project
 - Draft ~3 months of outreach strategies leading up to public workshop

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
Delta Conveyance Project
