### **Background**

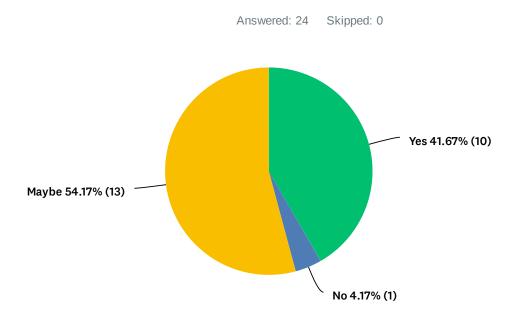
Staff collected 20 new Farmer's Surveys at the BBQ Luncheon. There are now 24 completed Farmer's Surveys in the system. The results of the survey can provide insight into potential projects CGA may take on if they decide to do so, fee study updates and information on approaches/options to reduce groundwater pumping in the Cosumnes Basin that are consistent with the interests of farmers/landowners.

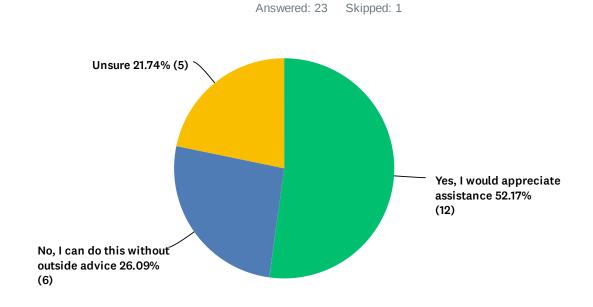
### **Recommendations**

Q1 The Cosumnes Groundwater Sustainability Plan calls for saving 3600 AFY in the first 5 years of the plan. Would you be open to finding ways to reduce pumping on your farm to help achieve this goal?

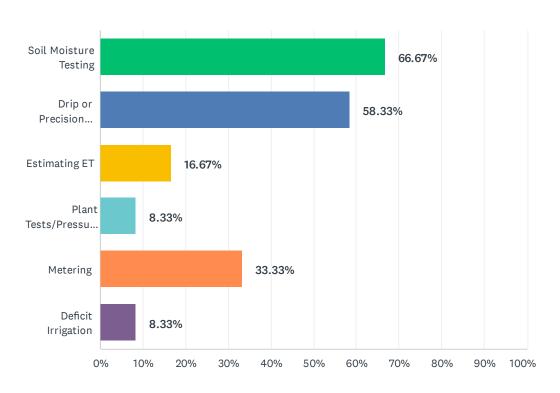


Q2 Would assistance from a Farm Advisor (Ag Extension Agent or similar) help or do you feel you could accomplish this on your own?

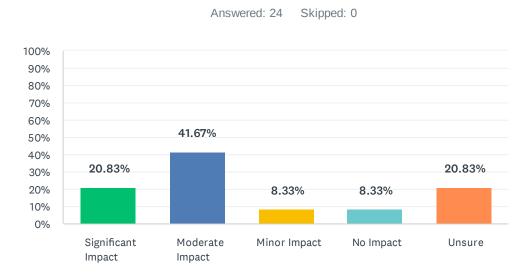


Q3 What type of water management or conservation practices do you currently use or would consider using in the future?

Answered: 12 Skipped: 12

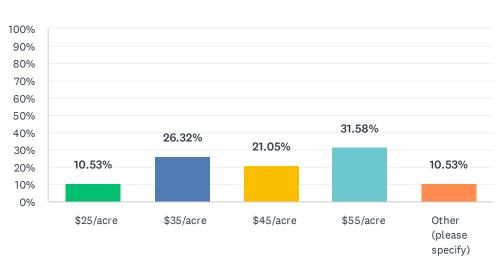


Q4 If you were to reduce water use by up to 15%, how much impact would this have on your farm income?

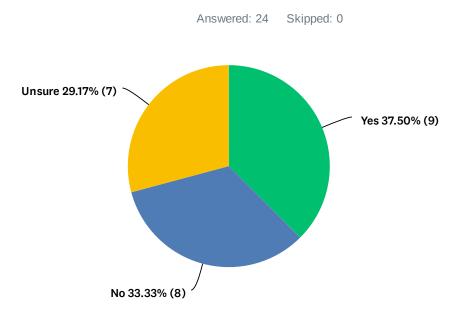


Q5 To implement water conservation practices that result in a 10-15% reduction in appliedwater, what amount of financial offset would you require?

Answered: 19 Skipped: 5

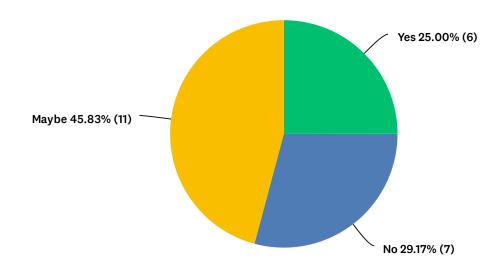




Q7 Would you be interested in considering land repurposing in the future?

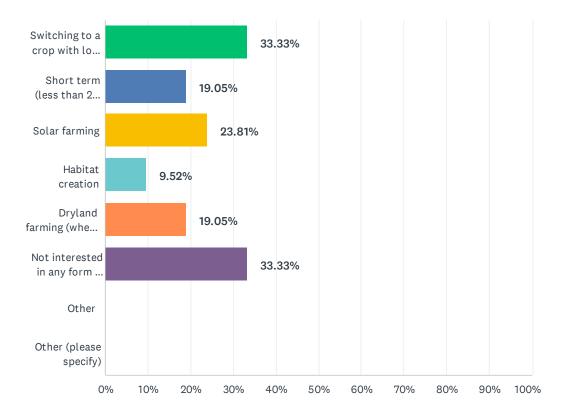


# Q8 If you answered yes to the previous question, on how many acres would you want to repurpose?

Answered: 21 Skipped: 3

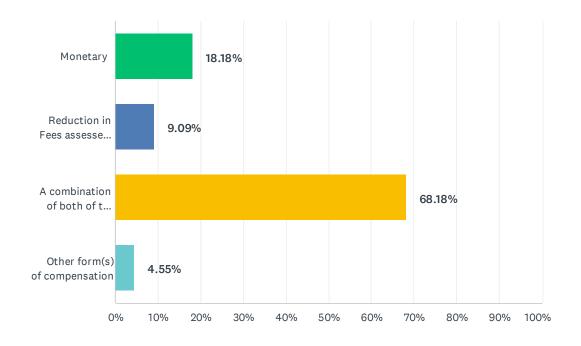


Q10 If you were to idle land on a portion of your farm on a rotational basis, what do you thinkwould be a reasonable yearly compensation?



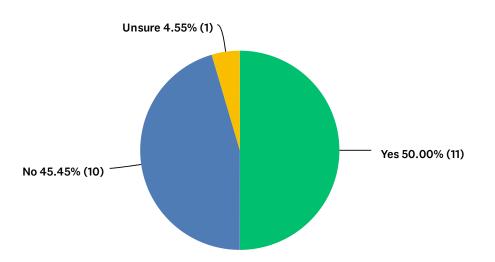
Q11 If you were to switch to growing a low water use crop, dryland farming, or another form of repurposing, what form of compensation would you most prefer?

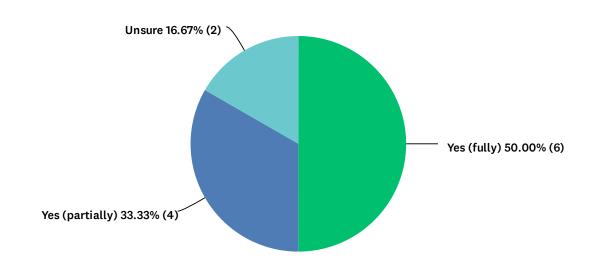
## Q12 Do you currently have surface water rights?

Answered: 22 Skipped: 2




# Q13 If you answered yes to the previous question, do you utilize those surface water rights?

Answered: 12 Skipped: 12

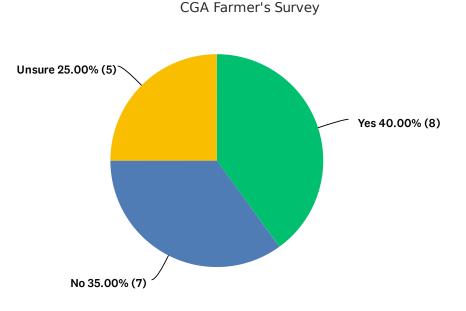


Q14 Would you consider aquifer recharge on your farm i f compensated in whole or part for implementation costs?

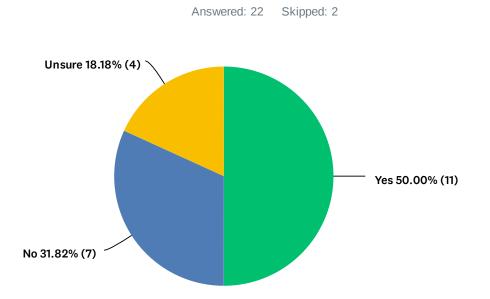


Q15 Do you grow crops that would tolerate being under water for a few months a year, every few years? For example, when there was flooding in the winter of '22 - '23?

Answered: 20 Skipped: 4

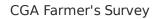


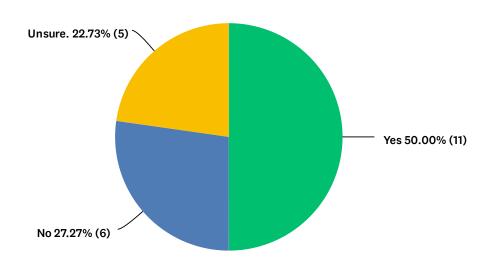
Q16 Do you live near a river, stream or water conveyance structure/facility that could deliver flood waters to your farm?



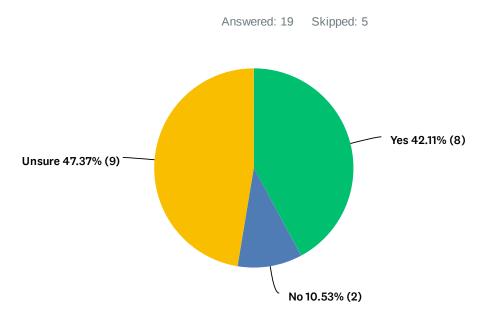
# Q17 Do you have low lying areas on your farm that collect water in the winter?

Answered: 22 Skipped: 2



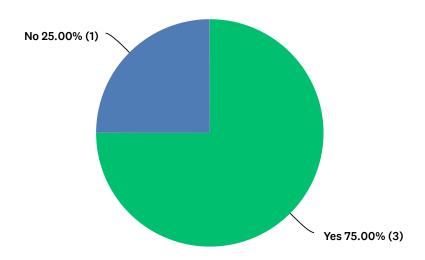


Q18 If you answered yes to any of the previous two questions, would you consider having a dry well installed in that area?
